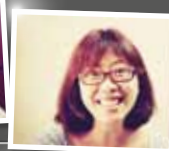

Today, I was touched by a young programme participant who asked me, “May I bring some stewed chicken home for my mother as she comes home very late from work?” He is from a single parent family with two other siblings and attends the Junior Chef programme regularly with 20 other youth.

It was really heartening to know that this programme promotes communication and bonding between the young participants and their parents, literally by tasting the fruits of their child’s labour.

The Junior Chef Programme aims to educate youth about the nutritional value of food so that they can

eat healthily and also learn culinary skills through recipes taught weekly by different volunteers.

Launched in 2011, the in-house programme scored a major achievement in September 2014 when our Youth Team was engaged by Fairfield Methodist Primary School to conduct nutritional and cooking lessons for 47 students over three sessions.

Last year’s Honours Night event was also particularly special to us. Our Junior Chef team baked 500 cookies - under the tutelage of a professional baker, to raise funds for FaithActs. The youths baked, packed and sold the cookies to guests at the event and raised more than \$600.

The Facebook message from a student's mother brightened my day!

I am encouraged by the affirmation that we are meeting the programme objective of helping the young who are weak in the language to improve their literacy. And as a result, they can keep pace with their peers and are motivated to study in school.

The Learn English for Academic Proficiency or LEAP programme is for students between the ages of 7 to 10. We started training trainers for the programme last August and the first 10-week session was conducted from 3 September to 15 October.

The programme's curriculum focuses on five components of literacy, namely phonemic awareness, word recognition, comprehension, vocabulary and fluency. Lessons are conducted in a fun way through games, experiential learning journeys, play and digital media. The students were assessed on their literacy levels before embarking on the programme and again after eight lessons, in order to monitor their progress.

We are encouraged by the remarkable progress of the programme's first intake of 12 participants and are heartened by the positive feedback from their parents.

Keeping Seniors Healthy

We were excited to run the community health engagement programme with Tan Tock Seng Hospital (TTSH) named “Stepping Out - Into Active Life”.

When the programme was launched in August last year, we were impressed with the 116 seniors who signed up enthusiastically. The comprehensive one-year programme included an assessment of geriatric problems; twice weekly exercise regimes targeted at improving seniors’ gait and strength to prevent falling; health talks on preventing falls, home safety and the importance of a good diet.

The programme was supervised and run by a team of TTSH doctors, nurses, physiotherapists and occupational therapists, and FaithActs’ staff and volunteers who helped the seniors stay active and healthy.

The seniors who Stepped Out Into An Active Life experienced an improvement in their physical fitness, strength, balance, walk and endurance.

Keeping Seniors Physically Fit

We were excited to see the number increasing for every intake. Since 2009, there were 321 seniors who participated in WOW Workout at Commonwealth Drive.

Given the benefits of this programme, we introduced the WOW Workout last year for the seniors living in Dover. 30 participants signed up for our first run and by the end of the year, there were 91 seniors participating in the programme on Friday mornings at Block 1 Dover Road.

The workout is a 10-week fitness programme for seniors with low and high mobility. They learn different types of exercises to strengthen their muscles. The seniors are assessed for suitability for participation in the programme. There is also an assessment for participants after nine-weeks to determine their progress and how they have benefited from the programme.

We saw how within a year, Ah Kong (picture on the left) had gained more strength in his arms, as he became more sociable. His wife also participated in the programme in the high mobility group.

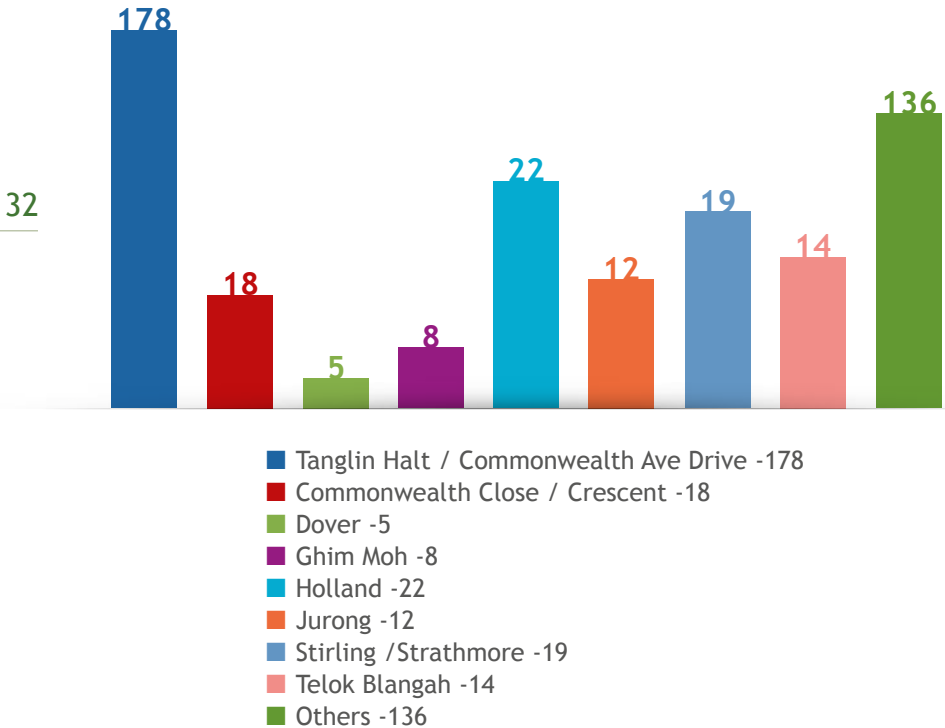

FaithActs Youth

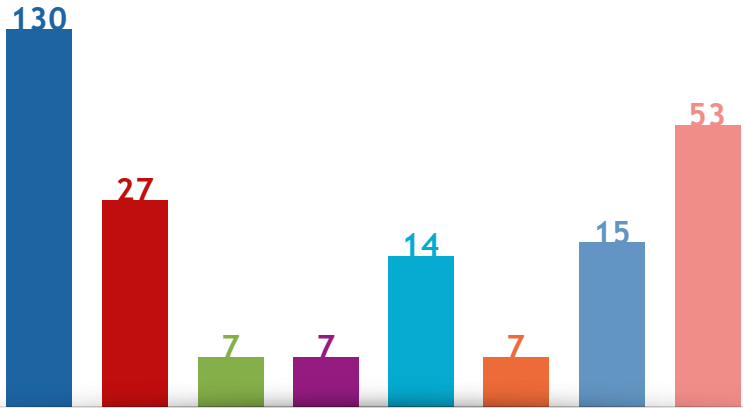
FaithActs started as a Youth Centre in 2004.

The first WOW workout was launched on 12

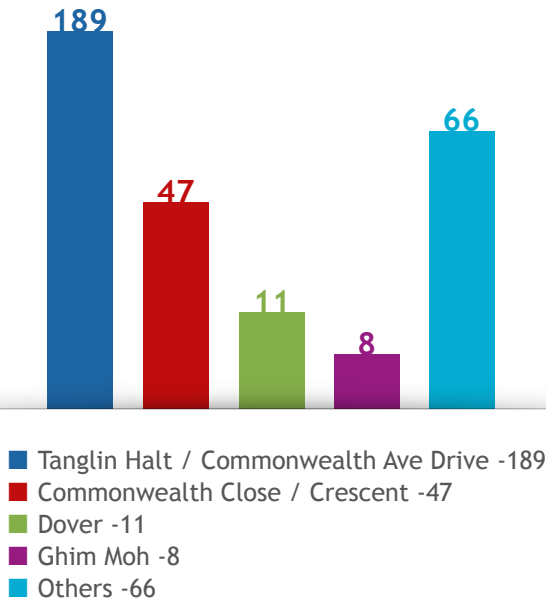
September 2009 with only 15 participants. We are glad to have served 313 seniors at the Centre in Commonwealth.

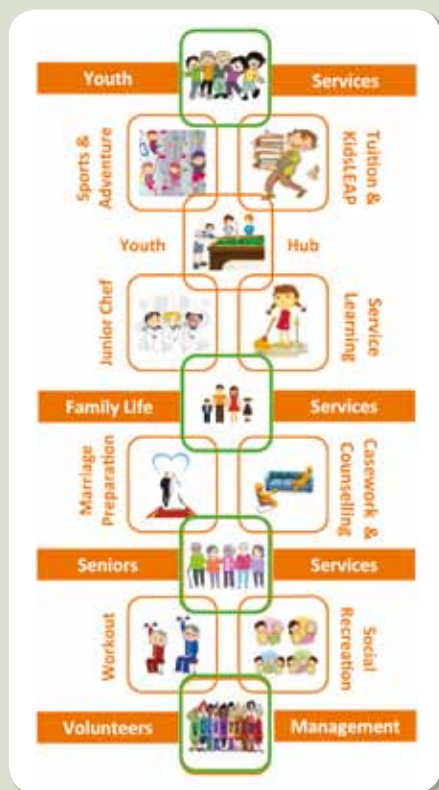
