# CHILDREN'S PROGRAMME – THE LEARNING HUB

The Learning Hub is an after school programme started in February 2017. It provides children with a structured learning programme that is out of the academic environment. In addition to supervising the children's school work, we also run enrichment programmes. These enrichment programmes are aimed at character development, to be more independent and also maximising the child's potential.

## YOUTH'S PROGRAMME – KidsLEAP / JUNIOR CHEF



The programme is to help kids improve their proficiency in the English Language. It focuses on 5 components of literacy and these are;

- 1) phonemic awareness
- 2) word recognition – sight words and phonics
- 3) comprehension
- 4) vocabulary and;
- 5) fluency.

It is a 10-week programme which includes a pre/post assessment on the literacy level of the kids. The programme is conducted in a fun way with various learning activities that engage the kids. These include role play and drama, games, experiential journey trips and usage of digital graphics to strengthen their command of the language.

KidsLEAP is conducted every Thursday from 3:30pm to 5:30pm in March and August. There are currently 21 kids in this programme.



The programme teaches children how to prepare simple meals for themselves. It also educates children to bond with their family through kitchen tasks or preparation of simple meals to appreciate their family.

We also organise kitchen tours for our regular Junior Chef youth to experience how commercial kitchens operate.



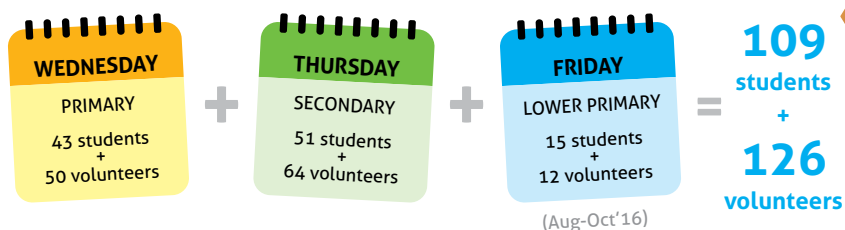
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## YOUTH'S PROGRAMME – TUITION-MENTORING / GROUP WORK, TALKS, WORKSHOPS



The programme helps students from primary and secondary school to cope with their studies, school adaptation and social issues. The tutors are also mentor trained to observe the students' academic, social and emotional needs. The students' results are monitored closely and we have many students who have done well through this programme. We also provide feedback to parents on the students learning style, coping skills and behavioural aspects. Tutor will coach-mentor up to 2 students to maintain good relationship building.

### Night Tuition 7:30-9:30pm



The activities above are aimed to develop character through life skills training. These include self-management of youth's esteem, emotion, communication, relationship, time, growing up issues, etc. We also inculcate social and community building skills to develop positive values for communal living.

## SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK / SERVICE LEARNING



### Adverto Programme

This is the second year we have conducted the programme for Fairfield Methodist School (Secondary). About 15 students gain invaluable knowledge through highly interactive skills-based activities in a non-academic programme.

The impartation of life skills and values allow the students to understand the importance of a positive youth development. It was observed that the Adverto Programme has seen students taking greater responsibility and ownership of their studies.



### Children Learning Culinary Skills with Social Values

The recipes are specially customised for age-appropriate preparation. 10 students from Fairfield Methodist School (Primary) have the opportunity to learn values such as patience, team-building, confidence, etc. whilst having fun with their food creation.

### Community Service Learning Journey

The programme engages students with the community through service learning. Through the hands-on experience acquired in community involvement such as; hawker centre "Clean-Up!", home cleaning of the frail seniors and block cleaning, students develop a deeper understanding of the role and responsibility of each person to his/her environment. They also develop a keener appreciation for the often-overlooked members of the community.

This year, a total of 397 students were involved in the Learning Journey from 6 to 10 March 2017. The project was carried out at Tanglin Halt estate.

## SENIORS' PROGRAMME – FUNCTIONAL EXERCISE / THE DOCTOR IS IN



Functional Exercise Programme was started on 4 of July 2017 to promote Senior's mental wellness to enable them to be independent. The programme is customised according to the seniors' cognitive ability. They are first assessed and thereafter, the exercises will focus on improving the critical areas. Exercises to slow down early onset of dementia includes; the reminiscence therapy; memory games and social interactions. Hand-eye coordination and muscles strengthening hand exercises are included to ensure they are able to perform the day-to-day tasks.



Many of our participants suffer from chronic illnesses and a number of them refuse to seek medical treatment. In order to provide a more personal care for them, we have made it less threatening by having them see the doctor at our Centre. The doctor engages them in casual talk making them comfortable before getting into their health issues. They are more open to sharing their health problems when they are not so overwhelmed.

We started with a volunteer doctor on 13 March 2017 with 5 seniors who made their first appointment to seek medical advice from our volunteer doctor.

### WOW Workout

The workouts are conducted at Block 50 Commonwealth Drive, Block 1 Dover Road and Block 118 Commonwealth Crescent. The workout helps the seniors to strengthen their muscles, improve their balance and lowers risk of falling. The workout are customised for low, high mobility seniors and those in the 'fit' group. Many seniors have benefitted from the programme having made a marked improvement in their overall fitness level.

This programme started in 2014 and is currently conducted by Sengkang Health physiotherapists. The intensity of the exercises is customised according to the senior's physical and health conditions. There are 8 Seniors participating in this personalised workout every Tuesday from 9am to 10am.

## MARRIAGE@WERKZ



Marriage Preparation Programme aims to equip couples for a fulfilling and blissful marriage, one that is beyond the wedding ceremony by preparing them with the skills and knowledge to deal with challenges in their marriage journey.

Marriage enrichment programme aims to enhance the marriage relationship by focusing on the positive aspects of marriage in communicating positively and successfully resolving differences to nurture and strengthen the marriage commitment.



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## FAMILIES' PROGRAMME – PARENT-CHILD BONDING



The programme received positive responses as parents and children learnt through the various interactive activities that promote communication, discover individual's personalities, accepting strengths and weaknesses to understand the virtues of family.

It was recognised that a child's ability to form secure emotional bonds with his/her parents has an important impact in the various aspects of the child's development.

Strong bonds will build a child's confidence, security, stability and are generally positive in responding to others.

FaithActs has conducted parent-child bonding activities such as: "Treasure Hunt ~ Finding Clues, Discovering Your Family Treasures"; "@mazing Race ~ Building Resilient, Strengthening The Family"; "B.O.W.L. ~ Building Others With Love"; and activities focusing on family values.



## FAITHACTS - WEST LEGAL CLINIC



This Legal Clinic provides free basic legal advice and information to the community and individuals where participants will be able to consult a qualified lawyer on a one-to-one basis in a 20-minute session on matters where they are unable to acquire lawyer representation. All legal advice based on Singapore law except for Shari'a law.

Our legal clinic is held once every 2 months on a Saturday morning from 10 am to 12 pm. Pre-registration is required as sessions with the lawyers are strictly by appointment only.
